What is Allerguard Allergy Nasal Spray and what is it used for

Allerguard Allergy Nasal Spray is a Medical Device which contains Ectoin® 2%, a natural cell-protective molecule with inflammation reducing and membrane-stabilizing properties.

Allerguard Allergy Nasal Spray can be used for the treatment and prevention of allergic rhinitis symptoms. Typical symptoms such as runny and itchy nose, nasal congestion, and sneezing can effectively be reduced.

Allerguard Allergy Nasal Spray is a slightly hypertonic solution and protects against the harmful influences of allergens and airborne particles and can also be used preventively. It facilitates the regeneration of sensitive nasal

Allerguard Allergy Nasal Spray is preservative free, suitable for children and sensitive noses.

Warnings and precautions

- Allerguard Allergy Nasal Spray should not be used after nasal operations or injuries of the
- Allerguard Allergy Nasal Spray should not be used in the case of hypersensitivity to Ectoin® or any of the other ingredients of the nasal
- If allergic reactions occur, the use of Allerguard Allergy Nasal Spray must be discontinued immediately.
- To ensure safe hygiene, each nasal spray bottle should only be used by one person.
- Do not use for more than 6 weeks after openina.

What you need to know before using Allerguard **Allergy Nasal Spray**

What should be noted during pregnancy and while breast-feeding

How to use Allerguard Allergy Nasal Spray Always use Allerguard Allergy Nasal Spray according to these instructions for use. Consult your healthcare provider or pharmacist before use if you are not sure.

If not otherwise prescribed by your healthcare provider, please apply 1-2 sprays in each nostril several times a day. Children 10 years of age and younger should be assisted during the application.

Before using Allerguard Allergy Nasal Spray for the first time, take off the cap and pump 2–3 times to release the air from the pump. Do not cut the tip. If the spray function is impaired (which might happen if the bottle is not

positioned upright), press the pump mechanism

several times in upright position.

- 1. Gently blow your nose to clean your nostrils. 2. Remove the protecting cap from the bottle.
- 3. Hold the bottle with your index and middle finger on either side of the finger rests and your thumb underneath the bottle. Bend your head slightly forward and close one nostril by gently pressing against the side of your nose with your finaer.
- 4. Insert the tip of the spray into your nostril and start to breathe-in gently.
- 5. Press the pump down quickly and firmly to spray into your nostril. Continue breathing gently through the nostril.
- 6. Insert the tip of the spray into your other nostril.
- 7. Repeat steps described above for the other nostril.
- 8. Wipe the exposed tip of the bottle with a clean lint-free cloth.
- 9. Replace cap on the bottle.

Possible side effects of Allerguard Allergy Nasal Spray

Allerguard Allergy Nasal Spray is well tolerated. Up to now, no regularly occuring or persisting side effects are known. Please inform your healthcare provider, pharmacist or the distributor of the product if you notice side effects that are associated with the use of Allerguard Allergy Nasal Spray. If conditions persist or worsen, contact your healthcare provider or pharmacist.

How to store Allerguard Allergy Nasal Spray

- The expiry date of Allerguard Allergy Nasal **Spray** is printed on the box and on the bottle.
- Allerguard Allergy Nasal Spray must not be used after the expiry date has passed.
- Allerguard Allergy Nasal Spray should be stored between 2°C-25°C.
- Allerguard Allergy Nasal Spray should be kept out of reach of children.
